SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The School Board is being asked to approve reuse of the FY2024 (2024-29) six-year scores for the Ketchikan Gateway Borough School District FY2025 EED capital improvement cycle application.

ISSUE: Alaska State law and Ketchikan Gateway Borough School Board Policy requires Board of Education approval for six-year capital improvement project lists for application to DEED. Applications are due September 1st, 2023.

BACKGROUND:

Under the provisions of Alaska State regulation 4 AAC 31.021(c) through (h) school districts in the state of Alaska are allowed to reuse previous years scores for their current application cycle. The re-use provision can be implemented once, the third year would require a new six-year plan and application.

2025-30 six-year projects explained:

- 1) Schoenbar Gym Floor: This floor was installed in 2007 by Alaska Industries after the remodel. Originally the floor was not supposed to be done. Problems with the remodel through a winter, weather was allowed to get to the old floor which led to the replacement. Since 2015 we have been experiencing buckling and heaving at random times, usually in March. This is due to possible excessive moisture intrusion under the floor. In 2020 we relieved the south wall to floor gap to allow for floor movement. We also began to run the air handlers 24/7. In 2021 we installed permanent fans that run on timers. The fans blow air under the floor and through the vented cove base. We have had a significant reduction in the buckling and heaving since these measures were put in place, however there is still some waving in the floor.

 We are looking into doing drainage work on the back side of the building. The hope is to lessen the water table and possibly moisture under the floor. If we don't come to resolution taking the old floor up, hydro-sealing the floor pit, and installing a new floor may need to happen.
- 2) Revilla Transformer Reposition: Revilla was built in 1987. It was built on piling, the building has not moved. The ground fill around the building has settled about 10 inches over the years. The pad mount Building Transformer has a significant list and should be repositioned, resulting from the settling. There is rust corrosion on the main switch and this should be replaced as well.
- 3) <u>VP complex Upgrades</u>: There is a want by TSAS to install larger windows in the building. There is also a want by TSAS to expand their office area.
- 4) <u>Playground upgrades:</u> We would like to get some of the older playgrounds upgraded with new equipment and soft surfaces.
- 5) Revilla Roof and siding: are at the end of there life cycle. We would like to explore the possibility of replacements.
- 6) <u>Houghtaling Transformer Replacement</u>: Presently the building transforming takes place in a HI Voltage room within the building envelope. This means we have transmission line voltage entering our elementary school. We have a desire to move this to a outside pad mounted idea. This would be a safer approach. It would also put any repairs on the Hilead on the utility company not the Borough District.
- 7) <u>Point Higgins School Renovations:</u> This would entail a full Mechanical electrical upgrade and would also replace the metal roof.
