SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The School Board is being asked to approve the application and acceptance of KGBSD's formula continuation grants.

ISSUE:

Per Board Policy 3291, School Board approval is required for grant applications exceeding \$5,000. Each year the District submits applications for the award of formula state and federal continuation grants.

BACKGROUND:

KGBSD receives federal and state formula grants each year. The School Improvement Grant is provided to schools identified as a Comprehensive Support and Improvement or Targeted Support and Improvement School by the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development. Fast Track Correspondence and Homeschool qualifies under this program. Funds are available for implementing evidence-based interventions as identified in the school's improvement plan.
