We are continuing with the **Free Breakfast and Lunch and School Supplies** for the 2021-22 school year.

We are also going to continue wearing Masks on our school buses this year. Buses are under the federal mandate because they are commercial vehicles.

The <u>Start Strong Committee</u> held a work session on August 12th with our local health professionals to create an initial COVID risk level threshold in the Start Strong Draft plan. We also held a Community Forum on August 12th where we listened to community feedback and answered some questions. On August 13th we had another work session with health professionals and the Start Strong Committee members to adjust the overall plan for our future board meeting that will be held on August 18th. Derek Meister, Special Services Director, met with <u>WISH/KIC</u> on August 10th, to discuss the Counseling program at Schoenbar and Kayhi. We had some robust discussion on what worked well and opportunities for improvement for this upcoming school year.

Derek Meister, Special Services Director, and I met with <u>Community Connections</u> on August 11th to build a process of communication. The meeting was a fantastic first meeting of the year and we plan to meet quarterly. It is important to build relationships with stakeholders in the community of Ketchikan.

We had our Administrative meeting on August 12; principals and administrative assistants are back in their buildings.





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August 13th was the last day of the Summer Food Service program. Thank you to all our kitchen staff, cooks, aides, delivery drivers, and scheduler for another successful summer serving Ketchikan's kids and families!

Upcoming is the annual on-site Financial Audit taking place the week of August 30th. We will need Board member representation at the wrap-up meeting toward the end of that week.

Preliminary year-end financial reports suggest the District maximized relief funding and other resources to free up local funding and protect the district's fund balance. This puts the District in a strong position heading into 2021-2022 even as we face more uncertainty due to the pandemic. More detailed financial information will be provided at the next Board meeting.

KGBSD Start Strong Risk Level Determination

The KGBSD will have a district-wide operating risk level. All schools will follow the mitigation plans for that level.

How is it determined: The number of active COVID cases in the Ketchikan Gateway Borough (as reported and published by Ketchikan Public Health on its <u>SmartSheet</u>):

Low: 5 or fewer active cases

Moderate: 6-25 active cases

Substantial: 26-49 active cases

High: 50 or more active cases

Who sets the levels: KGBSD Superintendent

When levels are set/changed: Weekly (set on Friday afternoon for the following week)

Individual School Risk Level Increases and/or Closures Determination

Who: Superintendent in consultation with district/building administration, district nurses, public health nurses, and healthcare professionals.

When level increases and/or closures are made: As needed

KGBSD Start Strong Plan: Educational Options

Options for Students:

- enroll at a school site and attend in-person classes following the risk level mitigation plans being implemented;
- enroll in one of the distance learning options (noted to the right).



KGBSD Start Strong Plan: Travel

Vaccinated Individuals:

- Do NOT need to quarantine;
- Do NOT need to test as long as they remain asymptomatic.

Unvaccinated Individuals:

- Test for COVID upon returning to Ketchikan;
- Return to school after receiving a negative test result;
- Taking a second COVID test 5-7 days after travel is strongly recommended.

Individuals Who Have Tested Positive for COVID-19 within the Last 90 Days:

The positive test result exempts them from testing or quarantine related to travel or being a close contact.
