From a talk hosted by the National Association of Counties (NACO) titled Leveraging the Arts to Promote Community and Economic Development at the 2025 NACO Annual Legislative Conference, <u>America250</u> is a multi-year campaign to commemorate and celebrate the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. This initiative is designed for the young people of America. It celebrates their perspectives and awards 25 first place participants with extraordinary and iconic trips to some of the Nation's most historic landmarks. 25 second place participants win a cash prize. It is the hope of the U.S. Semiquincentennial Commission this initiative and others, will continue beyond the celebration, and build more national unity.

America Gives focuses on three key pillars: charitable giving, volunteering, and public service, including military service. Anchored around the two officially recognized days of service established under federal law and Presidential Proclamation: Martin Luther King Jr. Day and September 11, America Gives will leverage these days to build year-round engagement and momentum leading up to 2026.

During the talk I attended, the chair, Rosie Rios, also discussed additional initiatives in the works for making July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2026, about more than just fireworks. She also discussed work toward additional initiatives, including **America's Soundtrack**, **America's Performance**, and the following, **Coming Soon** 

• **America's Culture:** An opportunity to showcase American art forms, creative expressions, and cultural touchstones, and increase access to and awareness of the arts in America.

- **America Innovates:** A traveling tech expo that will display America's greatest innovations as well as our aspirations for the future, asking the next generation of creators what innovations they want to create that will be critical for the next 250 years.
- America Waves: An initiative designed to create moments for all Americans to come together with their communities, to wave their American flags, celebrate America's 250th, and honor the contributions of those who brought us to where we are today.
- **Time Capsule:** A collaboration involving all 50 states, five territories, and the District of Columbia to collect items for a time capsule to be buried in Philadelphia on July 4, 2026.
- **July 4th 2026 Activations:** A national celebration in Washington, DC and across the country on July 4, 2026 in which we will partner with established groups who host legacy July 4th events as well as parade organizers at the state and local levels.
