SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Board is being asked to approve the FY '20 Six-Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for submittal to the Department of Education and Early Development (DEED).

ISSUE:

A Capital Improvement Plan for the district is submitted to the state each year by September 1. Our CIP list is developed through Southeast Regional Resource Center (SERRC). The District contracts with SERRC to produce DEED-required documentation for the CIP.

BACKGROUND:

A six-year budget plan (*attached*) is part of the FY '20 CIP. This CIP represents collaboration between district administration and the Borough on facilities improvement throughout the District.

Board Policies 7000 and 7100 address the role of the Board and Superintendent in regards to school facilities.
