SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The School Board's approval is sought for the Ketchikan High School Students to travel to New York City and Washington D.C. in October of 2025.

ISSUE:

Per Board Policy 6153, all school-sponsored trips to out-of-state locations require approval of the School Board.

BACKGROUND:

Social Studies teacher, Dave Mitchell, shared that students have traveled to Washington, D.C. with the Close Up program three times, in 2017, 2019, and 2023, totalling 73 students. The students who complete the program learn about our nation's history and government, and always return to my class much more engaged in learning more. This year we have decided to take the trip on our own, rather than through a program. This dramatically decreased the cost, and made it affordable to Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors.

I have been bringing students to Washington, D.C. with the Close Up program three times, in 2017, 2019, and 2023, totalling 73 students. The students who complete the program learn about our nation's history and government, and always return to my class much more engaged in learning more. I have found it to be very rewarding, for students, and the concept of "government" and "history" becomes personal, instead of a distant institution they have no part in. There is also an important cultural component as well, with art museums, Broadway shows, urban life and an architectural tour. Among the many benefits, this trip helps instill a call to civic participation for our aspiring leaders.

This year we have decided to take the trip on our own, rather than through a program. This dramatically decreased the cost, and made it affordable to Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors who can work this summer or participate in fundraisers in order to pay for the trip. Some of the students have already fundraised half the cost of the trip. Because of the reputation of the trip and being able to lower the costs, 42 students signed up to go to Washington, D.C. and New York City October 11-20, 2025.

Although students are the most important part of the program, this is an important trip for myself and other teachers as well. I bring back a lot of what I learn on site- Holocaust Museum, Mount Vernon, Ellis Island, Civil War sites, the Supreme Court, Capitol Building. I share all of these experiences with my students in Government, U.S. History, Economics and Law classes, and they have been an inspiration to me in my teaching career. But looking at the students in my classroom, I know that just sharing my experiences and showing pictures is not enough, and what a phenomenal and motivational experience it is for students to be immersed in learning.

I have confidence that an opportunity to be involved in this academic trip provides students the inspiration and connection they need to become civically engaged. I appreciate your support for this academic opportunity.
