Curriculum/PD/Assessment:

- The KNEPC is recommending the following budget priorities for Title VI: 100% of the Cultural Coordinator, 50% of each of the Native PreK teacher programs (certified positions only), and the remainder in supplies. The total amount of the grant has not been disclosed yet, but it is estimated to be around \$259,000.
- Todd White was here the week of April 25th. He helped finalize the Evaluation Pilot for this school year. The committee decided to have another pilot year next year and instead of having teachers opt in, it will be opt out, so that we can get as much feedback on the tool and process as possible. We have also started looking at who might digitize the tool for next year.
- We have started looking into what professional development will look like this fall: Envision, Karen Karp, and coming back around to PD that only happened virtually during COVID, such as Collaborative Classrooms.

Local Borough Appropriation

On Monday we presented the District's local discretionary contribution request to the Borough Assembly of an additional \$1,111,657 over last years' discretionary request in order to address the District's health insurance deficit. At that meeting the Borough Assembly directed Borough staff to present an ordinance that would fund the District's request at the maximum amount possible without accessing the \$2 million reserve in the Local Education Fund and requiring a super majority vote of the Assembly. This direction decreases the discretionary contribution to \$755,883 from the District's request. Should this action be approved by the
